Take Route 93 to the Route 89 North exit just south of Concord.

On Route 89 take Exit 1. Then turn left onto South St. Follow South St. 1.3 miles to Conant Dr. on the left. Turn left onto Conant.

Take the first left onto Rundlett St.
Tallwood House is on the left, up the driveway.
