KJV

(Gen 1:26) And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

(Gen 1:27) So God created man in his *own* image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.

(Gen 1:31) And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, *it was* very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

(Gen 2:1) Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

(Gen 2:6) But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

(Gen 2:7) And the LORD God formed man *of* the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

(Gen 2:8) And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed.

(Gen 2:9) And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

(Gen 2:21) And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;

(Gen 2:22) And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

(Gen 3:1) Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?

(Gen 3:2) And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

(Gen 3:3) But of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die.

(Gen 3:4) And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die:

(Gen 3:5) For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

(Gen 1:26) Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."

(Gen 1:27) So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

(Gen 1:31) And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

(Gen 2:1) Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

(Gen 2:6) and a mist was going up from the land and was watering the whole face of the ground—

(Gen 2:7) then the LORD God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature.

(Gen 2:8) And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there he put the man whom he had formed.

(Gen 2:9) And out of the ground the LORD God made to spring up every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food. The tree of life was in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

(Gen 2:21) So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.

(Gen 2:22) And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.

(Gen 3:1) Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?"

(Gen 3:2) And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden,

(Gen 3:3) but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.'"

(Gen 3:4) But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die.

(Gen 3:5) For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

(Gen 1:26) Then God said, "And now we will make human beings; they will be like us and resemble us. They will have power over the fish, the birds, and all animals, domestic and wild, large and small."

(Gen 1:27) So God created human beings, making them to be like himself. He created them male and female,

(Gen 1:31) God looked at everything he had made, and he was very pleased. Evening passed and morning came—that was the sixth day.

(Gen 2:1) And so the whole universe was completed.

(Gen 2:6) but water would come up from beneath the surface and water the ground.

(Gen 2:7) Then the LORD God took some soil from the ground and formed a man out of it; he breathed life-giving breath into his nostrils and the man began to live.

(Gen 2:8) Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the East, and there he put the man he had formed.

(Gen 2:9) He made all kinds of beautiful trees grow there and produce good fruit. In the middle of the garden stood the tree that gives life and the tree that gives knowledge of what is good and what is bad.

(Gen 2:21) Then the LORD God made the man fall into a deep sleep, and while he was sleeping, he took out one of the man's ribs and closed up the flesh.

(Gen 2:22) He formed a woman out of the rib and brought her to him.

(Gen 3:1) Now the snake was the most cunning animal that the LORD God had made. The snake asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat fruit from any tree in the garden?"

(Gen 3:2) "We may eat the fruit of any tree in the garden," the woman answered,

(Gen 3:3) "except the tree in the middle of it. God told us not to eat the fruit of that tree or even touch it; if we do, we will die."

(Gen 3:4) The snake replied, "That's not true; you will not die.

(Gen 3:5) God said that because he knows that when you eat it, you will be like God and know what is good and what is bad."

(Gen 3:6) And when the woman saw that the tree *was* good for food, and that it *was* pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make *one* wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.

(Gen 3:23) Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken.

(Lev 19:4) Turn ye not unto idols, nor make to yourselves molten gods: I *am* the LORD your God.

(Deu 6:4) Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God *is* one LORD:

(1Ki 15:11) And Asa did *that which was* right in the eyes of the LORD, as *did* David his father.

(1Ki 15:12) And he took away the sodomites out of the land, and removed all the idols that his fathers had made.

(1Ki 15:13) And also Maachah his mother, even her he removed from *being* queen, because she had made an idol in a grove; and Asa destroyed her idol, and burnt *it* by the brook Kidron.

(1Ki 15:14) But the high places were not removed: nevertheless Asa's heart was perfect with the LORD all his days.

(2Ki 17:9) And the children of Israel did secretly *those* things that *were* not right against the LORD their God, and they built them high places in all their cities, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city.

(2Ki 17:12) For they served idols, whereof the LORD had said unto them, Ye shall not do this thing.

(2Ch 16:12) And Asa in the thirty and ninth year of his reign was diseased in his feet, until his disease *was* exceeding *great*: yet in his disease he sought not to the LORD, but to the physicians.

(2Ch 16:13) And Asa slept with his fathers, and died in the one and fortieth year of his reign.

(2Ch 17:1) And Jehoshaphat his son reigned in his stead, and strengthened himself against Israel.

(2Ch 17:3) And the LORD was with Jehoshaphat, because he walked in the first ways of his father David, and sought not unto Baalim;

(2Ch 17:4) But sought to the *LORD* God of his father, and walked in his commandments, and not after the doings of Israel.

(2Ch 17:6) And his heart was lifted up in the ways of the LORD: moreover he took away the high places and groves out of Judah.

(Gen 3:6) So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.

(Gen 3:23) therefore the LORD God sent him out from the garden of Eden to work the ground from which he was taken.

(Lev 19:4) Do not turn to idols or make for yourselves any gods of cast metal: I am the LORD your God.

(Deu 6:4) "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.

(1Ki 15:11) And Asa did what was right in the eyes of the LORD, as David his father had done.

(1Ki 15:12) He put away the male cult prostitutes out of the land and removed all the idols that his fathers had made.

(1Ki 15:13) He also removed Maacah his mother from being queen mother because she had made an abominable image for Asherah. And Asa cut down her image and burned it at the brook Kidron.

(1Ki 15:14) But the high places were not taken away. Nevertheless, the heart of Asa was wholly true to the LORD all his days.

(2Ki 17:9) And the people of Israel did secretly against the LORD their God things that were not right. They built for themselves high places in all their towns, from watchtower to fortified city.

(2Ki 17:12) and they served idols, of which the LORD had said to them, "You shall not do this."

(2Ch 16:12) In the thirty-ninth year of his reign Asa was diseased in his feet, and his disease became severe. Yet even in his disease he did not seek the LORD, but sought help from physicians.

(2Ch 16:13) And Asa slept with his fathers, dying in the forty-first year of his reign.

(2Ch 17:1) Jehoshaphat his son reigned in his place and strengthened himself against Israel.

(2Ch 17:3) The LORD was with Jehoshaphat, because he walked in the earlier ways of his father David. He did not seek the Baals,

(2Ch 17:4) but sought the God of his father and walked in his commandments, and not according to the practices of Israel.

(2Ch 17:6) His heart was courageous in the ways of the LORD. And furthermore, he took the high places and the Asherim out of Judah.

(Gen 3:6) The woman saw how beautiful the tree was and how good its fruit would be to eat, and she thought how wonderful it would be to become wise. So she took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband, and he also ate it.

(Gen 3:23) So the LORD God sent them out of the Garden of Eden and made them cultivate the soil from which they had been formed.

(Lev 19:4) "Do not abandon me and worship idols; do not make gods of metal and worship them. I am the LORD your God.

(Deu 6:4) "Israel, remember this! The LORD —and the LORD alone—is our God.

(1Ki 15:11) Asa did what pleased the LORD, as his ancestor David had done.

(1Ki 15:12) He expelled from the country all the male and female prostitutes serving at the pagan places of worship, and he removed all the idols his predecessors had made.

(1Ki 15:13) He removed his grandmother Maacah from her position as queen mother, because she had made an obscene idol of the fertility goddess Asherah. Asa cut down the idol and burned it in Kidron Valley.

(1Ki 15:14) Even though Asa did not destroy all the pagan places of worship, he remained faithful to the LORD all his life.

(2Ki 17:9) The Israelites did things that the LORD their God disapproved of. They built pagan places of worship in all their towns, from the smallest village to the largest city.

(2Ki 17:12) and disobeyed the LORD's command not to worship idols.

(2Ch 16:12) In the thirty-ninth year that Asa was king, he was crippled by a severe foot disease; but even then he did not turn to the LORD for help, but to doctors.

(2Ch 16:13) Two years later he died

(2Ch 17:1) Jehoshaphat succeeded his father Asa as king and strengthened his position against Israel.

(2Ch 17:3) The LORD blessed Jehoshaphat because he followed the example of his father's early life and did not worship Baal.

(2Ch 17:4) He served his father's God, obeyed God's commands, and did not act the way the kings of Israel did.

(2Ch 17:6) He took pride in serving the LORD and destroyed all the pagan places of worship and the symbols of the goddess Asherah in Judah.

(2Ch 17:12) And Jehoshaphat waxed great exceedingly; and he built in Judah castles, and cities of store.

(Job 23:13) But he *is* in one *mind*, and who can turn him? and *what* his soul desireth, even *that* he doeth.

(Job 23:14) For he performeth *the thing that is* appointed for me: and many such *things are* with him.

(Psa 67:4) O let the nations be glad and sing for joy: for thou shalt judge the people righteously, and govern the nations upon earth. Selah.

(Psa 67:6) *Then* shall the earth yield her increase; *and* God, *even* our own God, shall bless us.

(Pro 2:6) For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth *cometh* knowledge and understanding.

(Pro 2:7) He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: *he is* a buckler to them that walk uprightly.

(Pro 2:9) Then shalt thou understand righteousness, and judgment, and equity; *yea*, every good path.

(Pro 2:10) When wisdom entereth into thine heart, and knowledge is pleasant unto thy soul;

(Pro 2:11) Discretion shall preserve thee, understanding shall keep thee:

(Pro 16:1) The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, *is* from the LORD.

(Pro 16:3) Commit thy works unto the LORD, and thy thoughts shall be established.

(Isa 2:22) Cease ye from man, whose breath *is* in his nostrils: for wherein is he to be

(Isa 2:22) Stop regarding man in whose nostrils is breath, for of what account is he?
