**abhor** - [B9 - Leviticus 26:11] - [NW1828] To hate extremely, or with contempt; to loathe, detest or abominate.

**adversaries** - [B16 - Luke 13:17] - [NW1828] 1. An enemy or foe; one who has enmity at heart. In scripture, Satan is called THE adversary,

**affirmative** - [S18 - 418:20] - [NW1828] That affirms, or asserts; declaratory of what exists; opposed to negative; That side of a question which affirms or maintains; opposed to negative;

**affliction** - [RR - Exodus 3:7 - [Wordsmyth] a condition of pain or suffering, or the cause of such a state.

**anointed** - [B19 - Luke 4:18] - [Wordsmyth.com] 1. to put oil or ointment on. 2. to confer high status or sacredness on by applying oil, as in a religious ritual.

**antidote** - [S17 - 495:10] - [Wordsmyth] anything that acts as a remedy or counteracts.

**apostolic** - [S21 - 366:14] - [OLQD] of or relating to or deriving from the Apostles or their teachings.

**ascribe** - [B15 - Deuteronomy 32:3] - [OLQD] attribute or credit to

**bondmen** - [B22 - Leviticus 26:13] - [OLQD] male slaves

**bowed** - [B16 - Luke 13:11] - [NW1828] Bent; crushed; subdued. Unable to stand straight. Good News Translation: A woman there had an evil spirit that had kept her sick for eighteen years; she was bent over and could not straighten up at all.

**confers** - [S18 - 418:20] - [NW1828] - To bestow (an honor, for example): conferred a medal on the hero; conferred an honorary degree on her. To invest with (a characteristic, for example): a carefully worded statement that conferred an aura of credibility.

**counsellor** - [B5 - Romans 11:34] - [D.com] an adviser

**despotism** - [S19 - 473:18] - [OLQD] characteristic of an absolute ruler or absolute rule; having absolute sovereignty.

**doing** - [S21 - 367:7] - [MW10th] to give or distribute as a charity

**ecclesiastical** - [S19 - 473:18] - [OLQD] of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church).

**epistle** - [S11 - 112:22] - [IP] a letter, esp. a formal or didactic one; written communication. (usually cap.) one of the apostolic letters in the New Testament.

**fetters** - [S25 - 227:1] - [Wordsmyth] 1. a chain or shackle placed on the ankles to restrict movement. 2. (usu. pl.) anything that restrains or confines.

**girded** - [B1 - Isaiah 45:5] - [Strong's] encompass, equip, clothe.

**hecatombs** - [S21 - 367:6] - [OLQD] a great sacrifice; an ancient Greek or Roman sacrifice of 100 oxen

**incentive** - [S20 - 454:18] - [OLQD] a positive motivational influence

**infirmity** - [B16 - Luke 13:11] - [Strong's] disease, sickness.

**iniquity** - [B15 - Deuteronomy 32:3] - [OLQD] absence of moral or spiritual values; an unjust act; morally objectionable behavior

**legitimate** - [S21 - 367:8] - [WCD] according to what is accepted or right.

**morale** - [S21 - 367:2] - [Wordsmyth] spirit. the mental or emotional condition of a person or group, as indicated by the level of enthusiasm, confidence, cheerfulness, or the like.

**parodies** - [S21 - 367:8] - [OLQD] make a spoof of or make fun of

**reverence** - [B9 - Leviticus 26:2] - [NW1828] 1. Fear mingled with respect and esteem; veneration. 2. An act of respect or obeisance; a bow or courtesy.

**scorn** - [B14 - Luke 8:52] - [NW1828] to deride; to make a mock of; to ridicule as contemptible.

**sovereign** - [S17 - 495:10] - [NW1828] 1. Supreme in power; possessing supreme dominion; as a sovereign ruler of the universe.

**stereotyped** - [S21 - 367:6] - [Wordsmyth] preconceived in a simple and often misleading way.

**synonymous** - [S1 - 465:11] - [WCD] having the same or a similar meaning; expressing the same idea or intent.

**tabernacle** - [B9 - Leviticus 26:11] - [Wordsmyth] a place of worship, esp. a spacious one. (usu. cap.) the portable sanctuary containing the Ark of the Covenant, carried by the Jews in their wanderings in the desert.

**taskmasters** - [RR - Exodus 3:7] - [OLQD] someone who imposes hard or continuous work

**tributary** - [S7 - 481:2] - [NW1828] Paying tribute to another, either from compulsion, as an acknowledgment of submission; Subject; subordinate.

**warrant** - [S21 - 366:14] - [NW1828] Right

**yoke** - [RR - Isaiah 58:6] - [OLQD] a connection (like a clamp or vise) between two things so they move together; an oppressive power

**yore** - [S25 - 226:29] - [NW1828] of old time; long ago;
